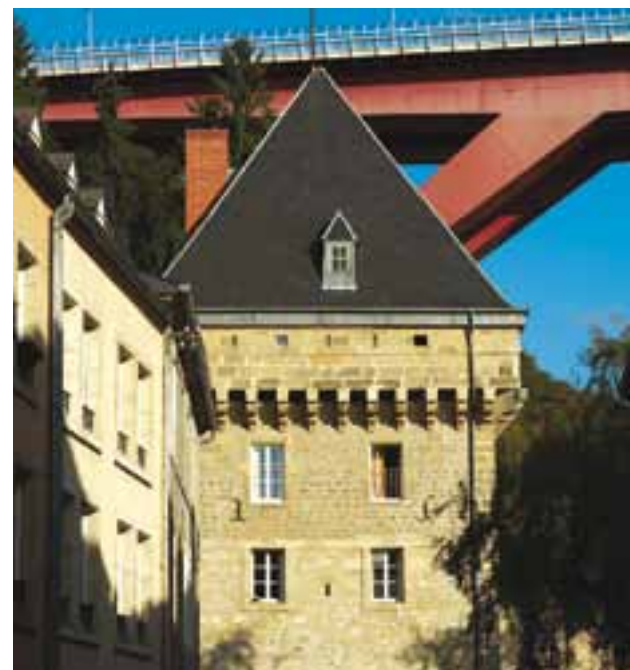
CITY SAFARI

The Safari tour looks at history through nature in an educational way throughout the urban jungle – learn about William II's horse and the two lions in front of the city hall. The adventure brings the past and future together through the present in a memorable and exciting format. A rather different city tour for children and families.

Did you know ...

... that the Bock Promontory is not only regarded as the mythical founding place of Luxembourg City but also as the legendary realm of Melusina, the mermaid? According to the legend, Siegfried, the first Count of Luxembourg, married a mythical creature with the name of Melusina. He had promised never to look at her on Saturdays but jealousy saw him break his promise and thus he looked through a keyhole and saw that his wife had a fishtail on Saturdays. Thereupon Melusina vanished in the depths of the Alzette and was never to be seen again, although she is said to appear at the Bock Promontory every seven years.



VAUBAN CIRCULAR WALK

The Vauban Circular Walk, named after the famous French fortress Builder, Sébastien le Prestre de Vauban (1633-1707), leads visitors through parts of the fortifications from the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries.

... that the "founding father of Europe" Robert Schuman (1886-1963) was a native of Luxembourg? The house in which he was born and grew up is still standing in Luxembourg-Clausen. His political career began in 1919 when he was elected into the French Chamber of Representatives (Assemblée Nationale). All through his life Robert Schuman retained an excellent command of his mother tongue.

LUXEMBOURG, A EUROPEAN CAPITAL

Get familiar with the European vocation of the city of Luxembourg! Here you find the historic locations of where it all began, more than half a century ago: the Luxembourg City Hall, the Cercle Cité, the "Maison de l'Europe", the birth place of Robert Schuman, the Council of the European Union, the European Parliament, the European Court of Auditors, the European School, the European Commission, the Court of Justice of the European Communities, the European Investment Bank and the Robert Schuman Memorial (all visits from the outside). "On the traces of the industrial revolution"

During a walk through the forest you will discover the beginnings of industrial development on the land around Luxembourg City. The walk bears the name of the family at the origins of the textile industry in Hamm in the Alzette valley, who also became city mayors. GARDENS AND PARKS

Due to a mild microclimate in the former monastery gardens at the banks of the River Alzette, artichokes, courgettes, olives and figs are still thriving today. Also, vines are harvested annually and wine is produced from the grapes.

THE LIFE & LEGENDS OF WOMEN IN LUXEMBOURG

This lively and graphic tour recounts the fascinating history of the outstanding women of Luxembourg, from the Middle Ages to the present. Their life stories, together with a variety of topics covering daily life and the fields where they exercised particular influence e.g. the struggle for civil rights and political freedom, their commitment in the areas of employment and education, cultural life and sport are all vividly portrayed. THE "ROSALI - ROSES OF LIMPERTSBERG" WALK

Thanks to a strong tradition of rose cultivation, Luxembourg was known all over the world at the beginning of the 20th century as the "Land of Roses". The "Rosali" circuit invites you to discover the horticultural heritage of Limpertsberg, a residential and student district.

Did you know ...

... that roses once were Luxembourg's largest export goods? More than a hundred years ago Luxembourg had the worldwide reputation of being the "city of roses". More than 260 new kinds of roses have been grown in Luxembourg. The Botanical Gardens of Rio de Janeiro and the Summer Garden of Saint Petersburg have both been planted with roses from Luxembourg. The two pioneers in rose growing, Jean Soupert and Pierre Notting, established their nursery in the city district of Limpertsberg. The "The Roses of Luxembourg – RosaLi" itinerary is more than just a homage to the nearly-forgotten odorant culture bloom. It's a discovery tour leading through a "manifold world of underestimated treasures" across Limpertsberg. Some of the old Luxembourgish rose cultivators – like the majestic "Tour Malakoff"-rose – are still available today.

THE CRADLE OF THE LUXEMBOURG IRON AND STEEL INDUSTRY DOMMELDANGE – EICH – BEGGEN – WEIMERSKIRCH CIRCUIT

Discover the history of the metalworking tradition of Luxembourg!

400 years ago there was a flourishing ironworks in Dommeldange and Eich, followed by blast furnaces. Nowadays the Scouts and Guides have their headquarters in the former Luxembourg Foundry. Learn about the people after whom various parks and streets are named as well as the origins of the listed buildings. In 963, Count Sigefroi built his castle on the "Bock" cliff, the very beginnings of the city of Luxembourg. In the mid-18th century, Austrians began the work of blasting of the casemates into the "Bock". In view of these impressive galleries, it is understandable why these fascinating fortifications became known as the "Gibraltar of the North". The archaeological crypt, anteroom of the casemates, makes the visit even more attractive. No wonder that the fortifications and the Old Historic Town enjoy worldwide fame: in 1994 they were designated UNESCO World heritage locations.

These underground galleries in the "Pétrusse" date back to 1644, when the Spaniards modernised the medieval fortifications. In the beginning of the 18th century the Austrians then reinforced the fortress. These fortifications belong to the part of the fortress which is still in excellent shape.

In its function as city residence of the Grand Ducal family, it is situated right in the heart of the Old Town. Formerly, the first town hall of the city occupied the site of the present palace; destroyed by a gunpowder explosion (1554), the town hall was rebuilt 20 years later. In the middle of the 18th century, the former City Scales were added as an extension, whereas the



Chamber of Deputies was built as an annex in 1859. Since 1890 the main building has been the Palace of the Grand Dukes. From 1992 to 1995 it was thoroughly restored.

The old Altmünster Benedictine abbey was destroyed in 1542 so that the Benedictine monks built a new abbey in the suburb of the Grund. The Neumünster Abbey consisted of a church and four wings enclosing an inner courtyard. At the end of the 18th century, after the French Revolution, authorities expropriated the Church of Saint John and the abbey was altered so as to house a military hospital which functioned until 1867. After the State took over the premises, Neumünster was used as prison for male inmates up to 1980.

After extensive restoration, the whole complex is now used as a major venue for social and cultural events and constitutes the Abbey de Neumünster cultural meeting place (CCRN). The centre cooperates with different cultural partners and facilitates concerts, theatre and conferences, seminars, open air concerts, studios and workshops for artists. The complex also hosts the European Institute of Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe, the Luxembourgish-German-French Pierre Werner Cultural Institute, as well as a restaurant.

The fortress of Luxembourg, also known as “Gibraltar of the North”, had been considered as one of the most important



fortresses in Europe for centuries. Due to its strategic location, it became a bone of contention for different European powers. The fortress, which had been expanded and reinforced progressively, today serves as a prime example of European military architecture. In 1994 it was included among the UNESCO world heritage sites. The Musée Dräi Eechelen – fortress, history, identities is situated in the restored keep of Fort Thüngen, an extraordinary historical building. The permanent exhibition illustrates a different era of the fortress in each of the casemates as well as its influence on the country's history. The tour begins in the Middle Ages with the capture of the city of Luxembourg by the Burgundians in 1443, and ends with the construction of the Adolphe Bridge in 1903.

More than 600 objects and original documents, many of which have never been shown before, highlight the diversity of the collections. A special room houses a selection of historical photographs which presents the fortress immediately before and after it was razed.

The history of the building of the museum constitutes in itself an important element of the permanent exhibition. With its impressive underground galleries and mines, it corresponds to a large extent to the original condition of the last phase of its expansion in 1836/1837.

During the Nazi occupation of Luxembourg (May 1940-September 1944), the train station in Hollerich served as one of the main gathering sites and departure points for young Luxembourgers forced to join the German labour service (the "RAD") and the German military service. Furthermore, thousands of politically-unfavourable Luxembourgers were deported from Hollerich. A number of the Jews who were living in Luxembourg were loaded onto the trains only a few hundred metres from this point and were displaced to ghettos or death camps.

Today, the train station in Hollerich is dedicated to the Luxembourgers who were forced to enter the German army, as well as to those who were deported and to the Jewish victims of the Nazi regime. It is where the "Centre de Documentation et de Recherche sur l'Enrôlement forcé", the "Comité directeur pour le souvenir de l'Enrôlement forcé" and the "Fondation du Mémorial de la Déportation" reside. To honour the memory of the victims of the Nazi regime, the Hollerich train station accommodates an educational and interactive museum accessible to the public.

Luxembourg-Hamm with its American military cemetery – Sandweiler with its German military cemetery – Ettelbruck, gateway to the Ardennes, with General Patton's Memorial and the "Musée Historique du Général Patton" – Diekirch with its impressive Museum of the Battle of the Bulge – Bastogne, Belgian border town, where one of the most decisive battles took place, and its Memorial and "Mardasson" Museum that reflects in a very authentic manner one of the bloodiest battles of our era.

To enhance your discovery, don't miss out on a boat trip on the river Moselle and a visit to Schengen, synonymous with the free movement within the EU member states (Treaty of Schengen).

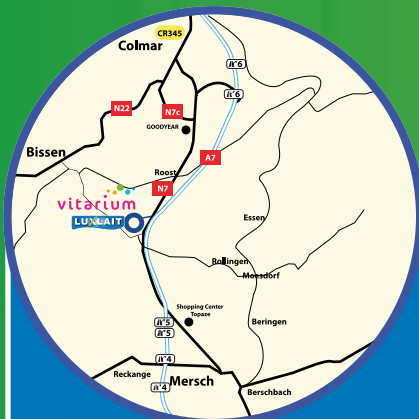

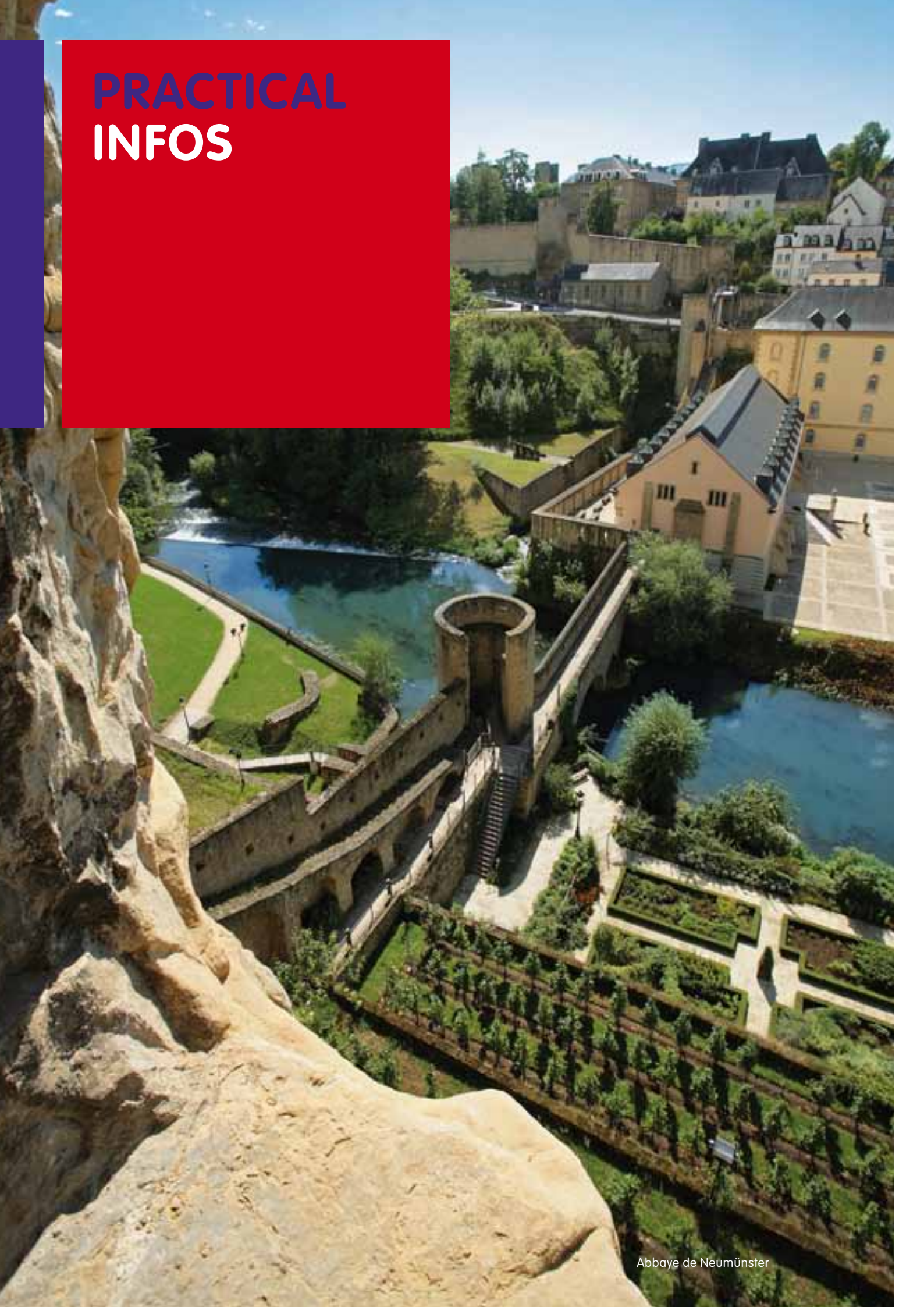

The three-day card allows free admission to the most important museums of the capital. Price: € 9 for adults, € 7 for youngsters (12-26) and seniors (over 60). Children under 12: free admission. On sale at the Casino Luxembourg – Forum for Contemporary Art, the Luxembourg City History Museum, the Villa Vauban – Luxembourg City Art Museum, the National Museum of History and Art, the National Museum for Natural History, the Museum of Modern Art Grand-Duc Jean (Mudam), the Musée Dräi Eechelen and the Luxembourg City Tourist Office.

"LuxembourgCard"

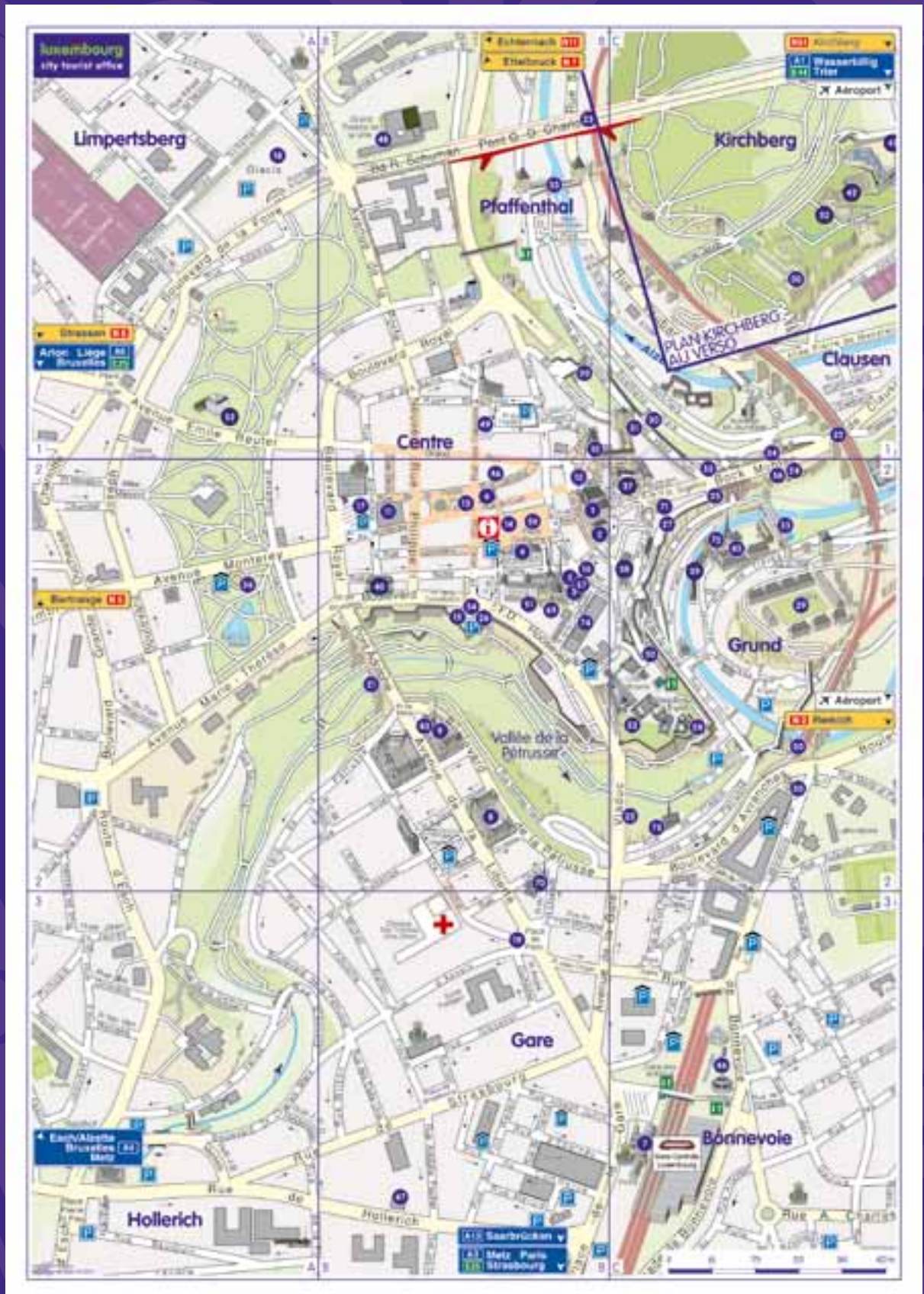

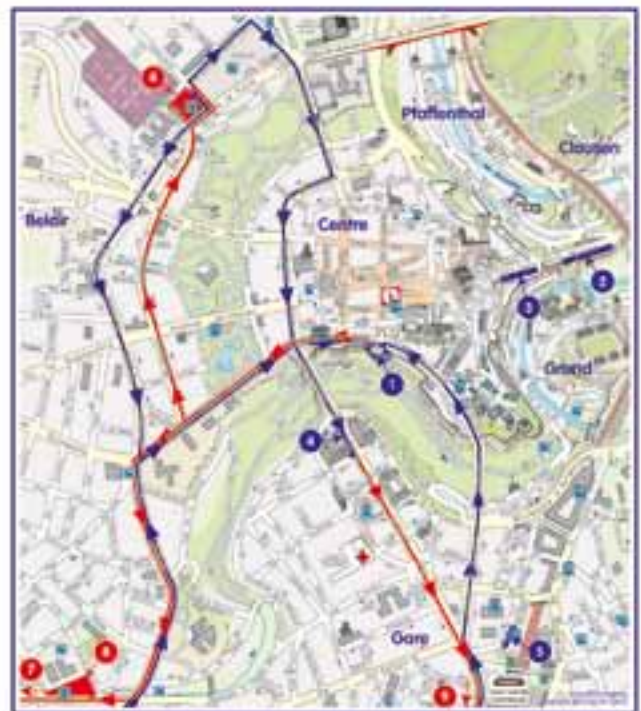
